

When the 2020-2021 school year began COMD-19 was still very present and the school board had a plan of action in place that was being led by the Assistant Directors of Pedagogical Services: Lynda Da Silveira, Silvia Patella and Michael Quinn. As time went by it was apparent that there was a significant amount of work involved in tracking COVID-19 in the schools and centres so additional help was required. The Director of Pedagogical Services, Geoffrey Hipps, asked two of the Pedagogical Consultants, Elaine Dabec and Stephanie Sacco, to join the COVID-19 Team. The COVID-19 Team adjusted the plan of action to accommodate the new members but realized that with atypical scheduling more members needed to be added to the team to cover the weekends so retired employees Josée Côté, Linda Di Domenico and Carmela Sacco joined the team.

Over the course of the 2020-2021 school year there was plenty to be done to ensure that all directives received from the govenrment and the CISSS were followed, as well as ensuing that all tracking of COVID-19 was up to date. For the school board the following data has been collected since August 2020:

737 epidemiolocal investigations
2,800 phone calls with public health nurses
2,100 letters to families and stakeholders concerned
60 meetings with the INFO-COVID team and management check ins
Hundreds of meetings with Public Health
Hundreds of classroom isolations
Suspension of in-person classes in a few schools that moved to distance education due to COVID-19 outbreaks in the school
